“Service Before Self: A Candid Tête-à-Tête with an IPS Officer”



Q: Sir, what inspired you to join the police force? Was this always your dream, or did your journey take unexpected turns?

I aspired to become a civil servant as early as Grade 9, driven by a strong desire to serve the nation. When I appeared for the UPSC examination, I secured a position in the Indian Police Service (IPS), which set me on this path.

Q: Looking back, what key decisions shaped your career and brought you to where you are today?

One of the most significant decisions I made was choosing Mechanical Engineering as my undergraduate major. However, my true calling lay in civil services, so I began preparing for the UPSC examination in my third year of college. That decision laid the foundation for my career in the police force.

Q: Reaching such a high position requires discipline and hard work. What personal principles helped you the most?

The UPSC journey demands immense perseverance. I believe perseverance is a combination of hard work and discipline. Staying committed to the goal despite setbacks is crucial.

Q: Balancing personal life with such a demanding role is difficult. How do you manage this balance?

In the police force, the line between personal and professional life is often blurred. We must always be available, regardless of the time—whether it's midnight or early morning, duty calls and we must respond. It is a commitment that comes with the uniform.

Q: Crime prevention is a major challenge. What strategies have you found most effective?

Technology has significantly enhanced law enforcement. CCTV surveillance, for instance, acts as a force multiplier—one CCTV camera is equivalent to a hundred police officers in terms of monitoring. It serves as crucial evidence in investigations. Additionally, patrolling vehicles moving across the city play a vital role in ensuring security and deterring criminal activities.

Q: What are your views on social media? Do you see it as a distraction for students or a tool for growth?

Social media is a double-edged sword. From a law enforcement perspective, it has opened up new avenues for cybercrime and illegal activities, making digital monitoring a crucial part of policing. For students, it can be either a distraction or a tool for growth, depending on how it is used. Responsible and mindful usage is key.

Q: In your opinion, how can citizens contribute to the betterment of society?

The first step towards being a responsible citizen is abiding by the law. Simple acts like following traffic rules, wearing helmets, and adhering to regulations make a significant difference. When citizens fulfill their duties, it allows the police force to focus on larger security challenges rather than enforcing basic compliance.

Q: Finally, what is the key takeaway from your journey that students can learn from?

Perseverance and consistency are the pillars of success. Above all, procrastination is the biggest enemy—it can derail even the most ambitious goals. Staying disciplined and committed to one's objectives is the ultimate path to success.

Harvesting Happiness – A Joyous Sankranti!

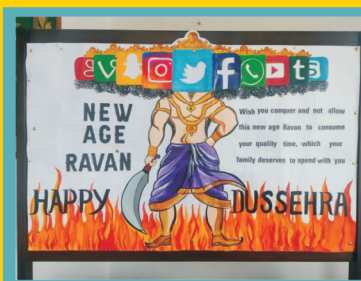

Parting Ways but Forever Connected!

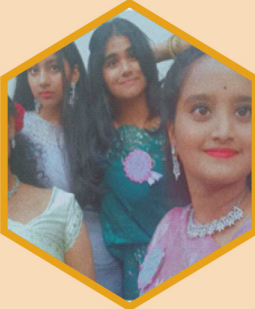

Brighter Minds is a brain training program designed to enhance key cognitive abilities such as focus, observation, comprehension, intuition, memory, confidence, and empathy.

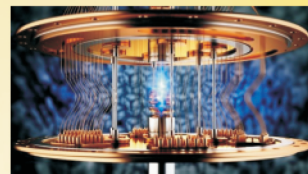
