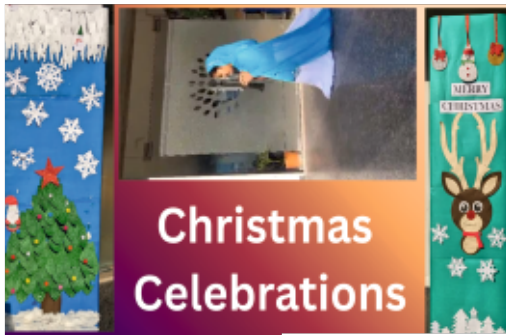
## Jingle Bells, Happy Hearts, and Delight All Around

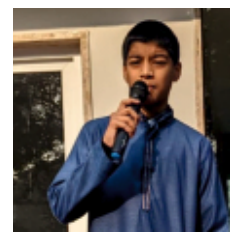
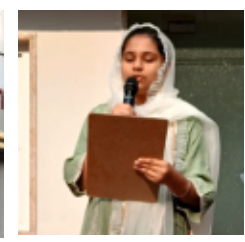
## Welcoming the New Year with Hope, Joy, and New Beginnings

unity filled the evening. Sanskriti's Iftar was more than a gathering; it was a beautiful reminder of faith, family, and friendship, leaving lasting memories for all.



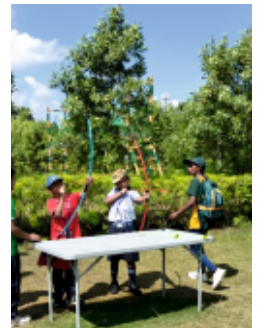

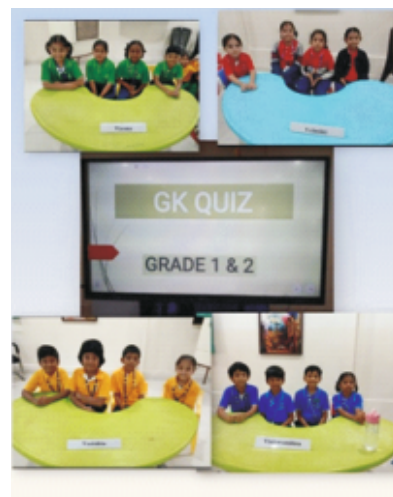
## CCA – SPELL BEE, MATH QUIZ, GK QUIZ.

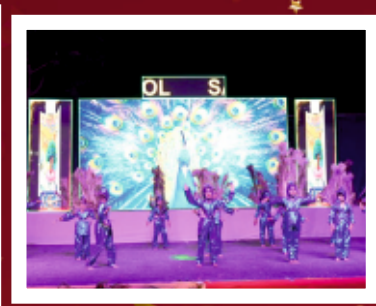
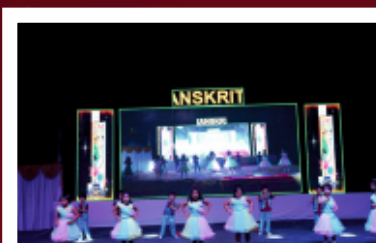
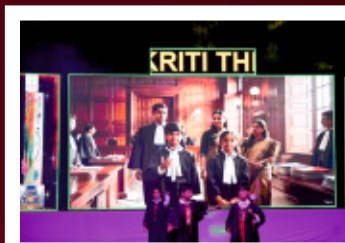
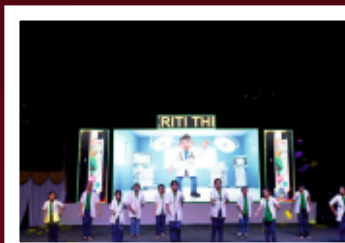
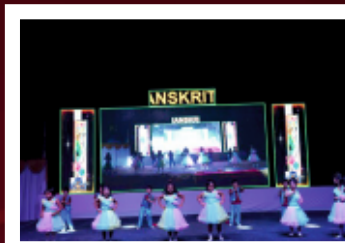
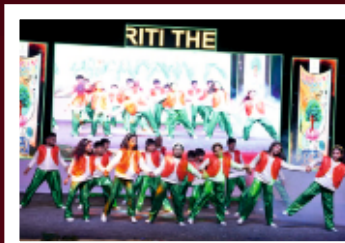
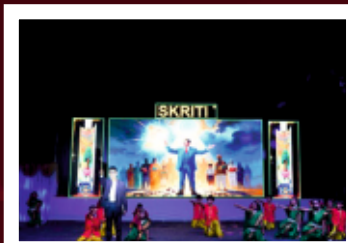
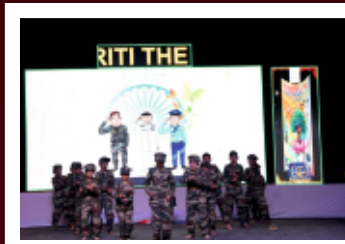
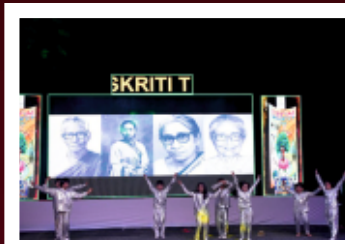
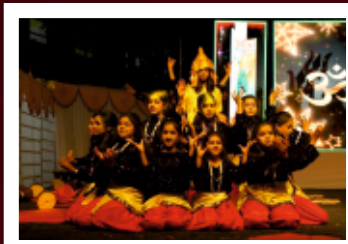
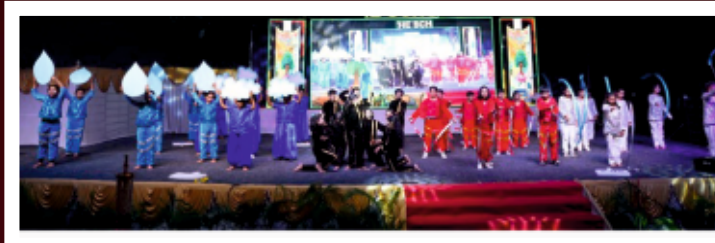
## Annual Day - Udgam Celebrations Recap !

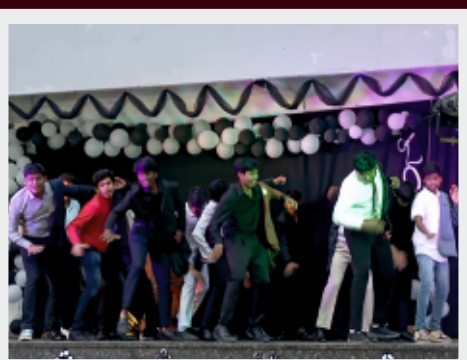
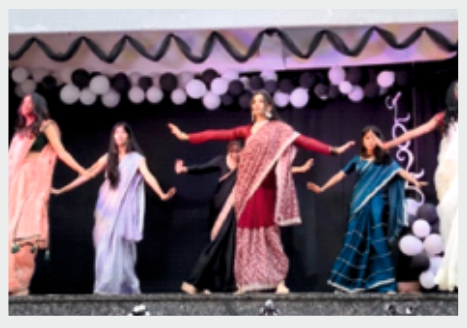

### Amazing Space Adventure

Rakesh Sharma, born January 13, 1949, is an Indian Air Force pilot and the first Indian citizen to travel to space. In 1984, he flew aboard the Soviet spacecraft Soyuz T-11, becoming part of a joint Indo-Soviet mission. Sharma spent nearly eight days in space, conducting experiments in bio-medicine and remote sensing aboard the Salyut 7 orbital station. His iconic quote from space, "Saare Jahan Se Achha," became a symbol of national pride. Sharma's journey to space began with his selection as a cosmonaut in 1982 after serving as a fighter pilot in the Indian Air Force. He underwent rigorous training in Russia, including tests for claustrophobia. During his space mission he and his crewmates focused on scientific research and even enjoyed Indian food prepared by the Defence Food Research Lab. After his spaceflight, Sharma retired from the Air Force and joined Hindustan Aeronautics Limited as

These experiments made scientific concepts come alive, showing how chemistry involves exciting reactions such as colour changes, flames, and gas formation. The celebration successfully inspired

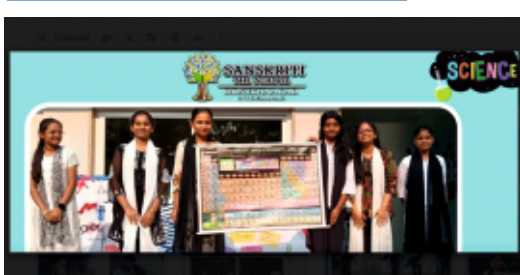
students to explore, question, and appreciate the fascinating world of science.

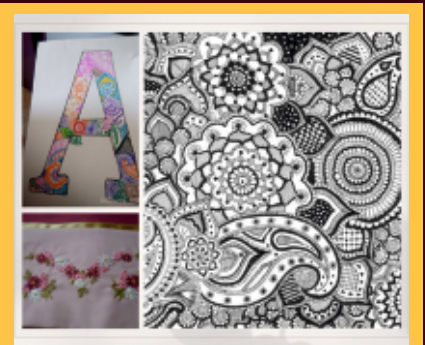
