

- Exploring the Magic of Blue!







AI is often imagined as a genius ready to take over human work, but that's movie fiction. Tools like chatbots are advanced pattern matchers, not thinkers. They assist creativity and problem-solving but cannot replace humans. Even experts cannot always explain AI's answers, showing it is far from an all-knowing "super brain."

How Transformers Power AI Modern AI, like ChatGPT or Grok, uses transformers—neural networks trained on huge text datasets to learn grammar, context, and meaning. AI predicts words based on patterns, using millions of parameters, but it doesn't truly understand. It crunches numbers cleverly but does not reason.

AI's Not-So-Smart Moments AI mimics reasoning but can get confused by tricky or culturally specific questions. Simple logic puzzles can trip it up, reminding us it's just a tool.

Using AI the Right Way:

Verify: Cross-check AI's answers. **Be Clear:** Good questions = better answers. **Use as a Helper:** AI guides; you do the work. **Know Its Limits:** It can't match human creativity or empathy. **Stay Ethical:** Cite AI and avoid sharing personal info.




Honoring Major Dhyan Chand: A Tribute to the Spirit of Sports





One day, Sophie and Sophia decided they would surprise their mother by going to the valley themselves and bringing back pictures of the bear.



The jungle grew darker. Just as the sisters began to feel scared, a soft glow appeared ahead. A beautiful white bird fluttered down in front of them.


"Oh, pretty bird, what's your name?" asked Sophie.

Chapter 5 - The Scary Snake



The girls burst out of the jungle and raced home.


Epilogue: The Best Surprise

But their parents were also worried. "You must never go into the jungle alone," they said.


They promised the girls a dog and a rabbit - as long as they promised to stay safe and take care of their pets.

Amazing Space Adventure (pause)

Rakesh Sharma, born on January 13, 1949, is an Indian Air Force pilot and the first Indian citizen to travel to space. In 1984, he flew aboard the Soviet spacecraft Soyuz T-11, as part of a joint Indo-Soviet mission. Sharma spent nearly eight days in space, conducting experiments in bio-medicine and remote sensing aboard the Salyut 7 orbital station.

His iconic words from space, "Saare Jahan Se Achha", became a lasting symbol of national pride. Sharma's journey to space began with his selection as a cosmonaut in 1982, after years of service as a fighter pilot in the Indian Air Force. He underwent rigorous training in Russia, including psychological and physical tests, such as for claustrophobia. During the mission, he and his crewmates not only carried out scientific research but also enjoyed Indian food specially prepared by the Defence Food Research Laboratory. After his historic flight, Sharma retired from the Air Force and later joined Hindustan Aeronautics Limited as a Chief Test Pilot. His legacy continues to inspire generations of Indians to dream beyond the skies.
