Investiture IIII Ceremony







Weaving a story of skill and Heritage

Weaving in India dates back to the Indus Valley Civilization, with evidence of cotton weaving at Mohenjo-Daro. Over time, techniques evolved, flourishing under the Mauryan, Gupta, and Mughal empires, producing luxurious textiles like muslin and silk. Before British rule, India was a global leader in textile production, but mechanized fabrics replaced traditional handlooms, causing a decline. Today, traditional weaving, including khadi and silk, has been revived, preserving India's textile heritage. However, the handloom industry struggles against power looms, where weavers face higher production costs and lower wages. While power looms produce cheaper textiles, handloom weavers craft unique, high-quality fabrics but often earn little. Government support is crucial to save the industry. Providing subsidized raw materials, promoting handloom products, and ensuring fair wages would help preserve this cultural heritage and improve weavers' livelihoods.



More government intervention is required to save this industry. The government can provide raw material at subsidized costs, and help with marketing and sales, since wholesale dealers demand that handloom saris are been sold at power looms rates. Weavers can also be provided schemes.
